Alfred Bernhard Nobel (1833-1896) was a Swedish chemist engineer, innovator, armaments manufacturer and the inventor of dynamite.

Nobel was born on 21 October, 1833, in Stockholm, Sweden. He was educated in Russia, France and the United States. He was fluent in five languages and had great interest in literature. Nobel was also very interested in social and peace related issues, and held views that were considered radical during his time. Nobel travelled widely, then returned to work in his father's factory in St Petersburg, Russia. Later, in Sweden, Nobel began to experiment with explosions. In 1867, he received a <u>patent</u> for dynamite. About 1875 he produced an event more powerful explosive called blasting gelatin. In all, Nobel held more than 100 patents.
